CDC Shortens Recommended Quarantine Period

The CDC announced on Tuesday that they are shortening the recommended period of quarantine following an exposure to someone diagnosed with Covid-19 from 14 days to 7 or 10 days. They announced that *"quarantine can end after 10 days without a covid-19 test if the person has reported no symptoms or after 7 days with a negative test result if the person has reported no symptoms."* The CDC also noted that local health agencies may determine if they will require longer quarantine periods due to local conditions and needs.

Covid-19 Vaccine Updates



The Milwaukee Journal Sentinel reported on Wednesday that vaccine distribution in Wisconsin to highest priority individuals could begin in less than two weeks should the FDA approve distribution.

Also on Wednesday, the United Kingdom announced approval of a vaccine and will be the first western country to begin distribution

The Menominee Restoration Act returned federal recognition and sovereignty back to the Menominee Indian Tribe of Wisconsin

The Menominee Termination Act was passed in 1954. It took another two decades before President Nixon signed the restoration act reversing that decision and by 1975 Menominee County was returned to reservation status.
