

After You Get the Vaccine What to Do



- Make a plan to get your second dose of the vaccine (Most COVID-19 vaccines will require 2 doses -Moderna: 28 days after the first dose & Pfizer: 21 days after the first dose).
- Know the common side effects (Fever, chills, tiredness, headaches, or pain or swelling on your arm where you got the vaccine).
- Know when to call a health care provider (Redness or tenderness increases after 24 hours, and/or if your side effects worry you or if they last longer than a few days).

 Find a safe place to keep your COVID-19 vaccination card.
