Question: What are antiviral medications?

Answer: Antiviral medications help people to fight off infections from a virus. They can help people experience less severe symptoms and shorten the length of an illness.

CARRIE Q Question: Is it true that COVID-19 symptoms can come back after taking an antiviral?

Answer: Yes, it is true that some people who have taken Paxlovid (one of 2 available oral antiviral medications) may get reocurring symptoms of COVID-19 several days after finishing the medication. However, researchers are still confident that antiviral medications are highly effective in preventing hospitalization and deaths. Reoccuring symptoms are mild and only happen in a small number of cases. If you or a loved one tests positive for COVID-19 and have a health condition such as diabetes, heart disease, dementia or any condition that may put a person at risk for severe disease, antiviral medications are still being recommended as treatment. Antiviral medications need to be started right away after testing positive. Contact your health provider for a full list of conditions that would make someone eligible for antiviral medication.

Can I still go and get COVID Tested for Free?

The answer is **YES**! Milwaukee still has locations that are giving free PCR COVID-19 tests for anyone 12 months or older, regardless if you have symptoms or not. PCR tests work by finding the DNA or RNA of a disease-causing organism, or abnormal cell in a sample. These tests can find evidence of the disease in the earliest stages of infection, and the tests are fast and highly accurate. You can save time and

You Can Still Order Free At-Home COVID Tests!

Every household in the U.S. is eligible to order free at-home COVID-19 tests from the federal government. The tests are completely free. Orders will usually ship directly to your home in 7-12 days. Order your tests now so you have them when you need them. Individuals without accessible internet access or who need additional support to place an order can call **800-232-0233.** Currently, this is the third round of free at-home tests that are being given out.
